

Edited TLC Council Meeting Minutes

Wednesday, November 4, 2020, 7:00pm via Zoom

Meeting was called to order by president, Kelly Ven-Huizen.

Devotions

- 1. Old Business
- Video/Streaming Upgrade to record to a flash drive and add an additional HD camera would cost approximately \$16,500. This upgraded system would allow for enhanced live streaming of our worship service. It was noted again that the considerable numbers that view Trinity's worship service online each week should be taken into consideration as we discuss an upgrade to our live streaming capability. The upgrade will be presented to the congregation for approval at a special meeting on November 8.
- Nominating Committee Kelly will check in with Brad and Carl.
- Thanksgiving Eve service Trinity will host the community service on November 25 at 7:00pm.
- Red Willow Bible Camp they will hold their annual meeting at Trinity on Saturday, November 14 at 2:00pm. The new bishop will be here to install the camp director. 65-70 people are expected to attend.
- Drive-up drop box tabled for more conversation.
- 2. Office Manager's Report
- Motion to approve the report by Bob, second by Scott L. Motion carried.
- 3. Secretary's Report
- Motion to approve the report by Scott L., second by Larry. Motion carried.

- 4. Property/Building Committee Report
- Two parsonage basement windows were replaced by Seth Hanson.
- The carpet tile in the Fireside Room has been professionally cleaned. The furniture is back in place.
- Charlie Olson, Dane Mueller, Roger Schilke, Scott and Tatum Loge cleaned and oiled the ceiling fans in the sanctuary.
- Roger Schilke has donated a fuel oil water heater along with additional parts for installation. Roger is no longer bonded so he cannot do the installation. The cost to have the heater installed is approximately \$750. Larry and Roger will contact someone to install.
- Recently, elements in our boiler system were found to be burned out. Ottertail discovered that a bird landing had caused the damage. The expense to repair the boiler is estimated to be up to \$7,000. Larry is working with our insurance company for possible coverage of the expense.
- The propane furnace in the north addition of the church is nearing the end of its expected life. While it is currently working, the council should anticipate replacing the unit at a cost of about \$5,000.
- 5. Property/Grounds Committee Report
- Tom Dahl winterized the water line to the Rock Garden.
- Scott spoke to Tim Erickson for snow removal.
- 6. Evangelism Committee Report-tabled.
- 7. Social & Fellowship Committee Report-nothing to report.
- 8. Stewardship Committee Report
- Karen reported that 300 cookbooks have been ordered. She expects to receive them the first week in December. The books will be sold for \$20 each.


