



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Psalm 121

- "I lift up my eyes to the hills—from where will my help come?
- ² My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.
- ³He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber.
- ⁴He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep.
- ⁵ The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade at your right hand.
- ⁶The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night.
- ⁷ The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life.
- ⁸ The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore."


This is one of my favorite Psalms. I often suggest it as an alternative to Psalm 23 for funerals. This Psalm especially called to me when I was mourning and trying to make sense of my brother's suicide. I could not understand his choice and I was struggling with what I could have done differently, called more often, reached out. Watching my family hurt and my mother trying to climb in the coffin with him at the viewing was very difficult. Yes, it is true, parents should not have to bury their kids. However this Psalm pulled and pushed me through this time. It gave me hope. It reminded me of whose I was, and who has my back in all things no matter what.

I have turned to this Psalm for reassurance in the times we are in now. I will admit that I am struggling as a leader not being with people, not visiting, not administering the sacraments, not "doing" enough. Being isolated, even as an introvert, has been hard and I have struggled and am still struggling if I am honest. But revisiting this text is a good reminder that no matter what, God is here. God is here to help, to strengthen, to keep me in all things, to encourage, to shade, to hold me steady when I cannot. Yes, God is Good.

As we approach Pentecost I am filled with hope. The Holy Spirit came to the disciples and the Holy Spirit comes to you. We come with open hearts and open minds ready for the Spirit to work in and through us. We know that the advocate is sent to us for comfort, counsel, assurance, help and encouragement. I pray that in these times, such as they are, you would experience the Holy Spirit in new and wondrous ways. We do not know what that will be or how it will look, but yet we pray: *Come, Holy Spirit, come.*
